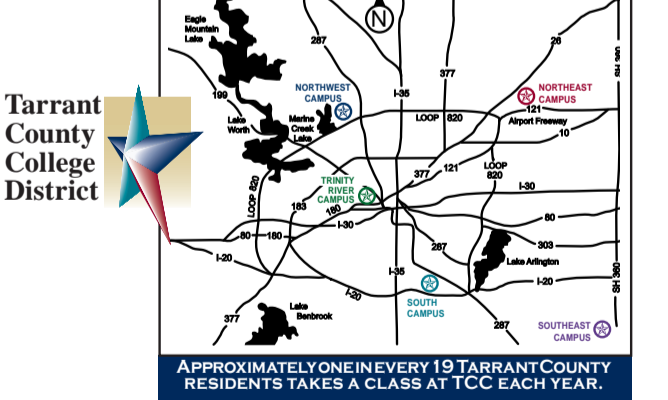
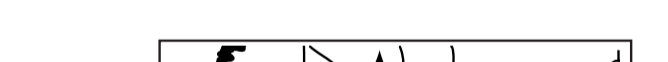
- **Small Business Development Center (SBC):** Provides small business owners practical assistance and solutions to help them survive, grow and prosper in no cost to qualified adults.
